

CEPAR Industry and Government Fellowship Scheme

Objectives

The aims of the CEPAR Industry and Government Fellowship Scheme are to strengthen collaborative links between CEPAR and its partner organisations (POs) and provide career development opportunities for members of CEPAR and its POs.

The Scheme

Personnel from POs may apply to spend a period of time at CEPAR to work on a collaborative project.

- The length and nature of the fellowship is negotiable but should total at least two weeks over a period of six months.
- The Fellow will be hosted by at least one CEPAR Chief Investigator (CI) based at a CEPAR node of the University of New South Wales, the University of Sydney, and/or the Australian National University.
- The Fellow will be provided with a workstation in an open plan office at one of CEPAR's nodes
- The position will not be remunerated

POs may also offer Industry and Government Fellowships to CEPAR Research Fellows and students. POs wishing to host a CEPAR Fellow should contact a CEPAR CI in the first instance to identify a suitable candidate and discuss the nature and duration of the fellowship.

Application Process

Personnel from POs wishing to be considered for the program should first discuss their application with a CI or CIs working in their area of interest (a list of CIs and their areas of interest is available at <http://www.cepar.edu.au/chief-investigators.aspx>) as well as their supervisor at the partner organisation.

Once agreement is reached with the host CI and PO, the applicant should email CEPAR's Director of Operations, Anne Gordon (a.gordon@unsw.edu.au) and provide the following:

- CV
- Details of the duration of fellowship (proposed start and end dates)
- A brief statement outlining the purpose of the fellowship and how the applicant hopes to benefit from their time with CEPAR
- Details of the proposed program: i.e., details of any collaborative research programs, participation in workshops and seminars etc.
- Letters of support from the host CI(s) and the PO

Successful candidates will be made an offer of a non-remunerated Industry and Government Fellowship position within two weeks of the receipt of these details.

The host node will be responsible for managing the Fellowship, including organising access to buildings and computer systems, insurance coverage etc.
