Long-term care is one of the most rapidly growing industries in the world. This conference will bring together academics, policy makers and industry leaders to explore new directions in Long-term care, focusing on the coordination between policy initiatives and industry and investment imperatives. Opportunities for interaction between industry representatives, and between industry and policy makers, will be facilitated.

This is the fourth conference in a triennial series which began in 2007 in Berlin, which was attended by more than 1,000 participants. Since then, events have been held in Hong Kong and Atlanta, USA, and the conference series has gained an enviable reputation as one of the world's strongest in bringing together industry and policy leaders in the field.

Long-term care developments are moving very rapidly in Asia, essentially driven by demography: the number of people aged 80 and above in Asia will quadruple to more than 250 million by 2050.
